We hope your popcorn sales are poppin' right along. Whether it's door-to-door in the neighborhoods, Show N Sells at stores or on-line, it's time to make some pack money to defray the costs of our activities.

There are lots of monetary rewards for your Scouts, too. Besides the gift cards from Trail's End, there will be a \$50, \$30, and \$20 reward for the top 3 sellers and \$200 for the den that sells the most to be used at their choosing.

Don't forget the Zyclone that can be earned at the \$600 level and the pack will reimburse your dues if you Scout sells \$850.

In October, we will email you an Excel spreadsheet where you can enter your door-to-door sales. That will be due to your den leader by October 15.

On the right we've listed our adult volunteers and leaders. You'll notice that each rank has 2 to 4 Den Chiefs. A Den Chief is a Boy Scout who takes training and then works with our Den Leaders to lead the den meetings. This earns them leadership credit toward their rank advancement. And besides the help they lend to the Den Leader, it allows your Scouts to see just what a Boy Scout can become. We point this out because having this many is unheard. Some packs are lucky to get 1 or 2 and then only for their Webelos. Many don't have any Den Chiefs at all. So to have as many as 4 for one rank is a great blessing and speaks to the exceptional Troop we're associated with. Kudos to Olwynne Crampton for her work with the Boy Scouts: both by encouraging them and showing them value of leading in this capacity.

Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program. It was introduced 1 year after the BSA was started in 1911. Boys have to want to achieve it and they have to work hard to get it: 21 merit badges, 6 rank advancements, demonstrate the Scout Oath and Law through leadership, service and teamwork, and follow through on an extensive service project. Young men who place Eagle Scout on their resumes have time and time again, received better jobs, better pay and earned respect because of it. One was never an Eagle Scout. Once an Eagle Scout, always an Eagle Scout.



Preparing your son for Eagle starts now. The 10<sup>th</sup>, and certainly not least, purpose of Cub Scouts is "to prepare for Boy Scouts." Don't say "if" he earns Eagle, but "when".

Like Sudoku, even though difficulty may vary from puzzle to puzzle, the rules for playing KenKen are fairly simple:

- For a 6x6 puzzle, fill in with the numbers 1-6
- Do not repeat a number in any row or column.
- The numbers in each heavily outlined set of squares, called cages, must combine (in any order) to produce the target number in the top corner of the cage using the mathematical operation indicated.
- Cages with just one box should be filled in with the target number in the top corner.
- A number can be repeated within a cage as long as it is not in the same row or column.
